

NUS CENTRE FOR THE ARTS

Established in 1993, NUS Centre For the Arts (CFA) is a vibrant space for the appreciation of the arts and nurturing of the creative and inquiring spirit. We support student engagement with the arts and the integration of the arts into the life of the University.

CFA includes the NUS Museum, NUS Baba House and a Talent and Development arm that oversees 22 student arts excellence groups. Through our myriad of programmes, practices, exhibitions, workshops and outreach, such as NUS Arts Festival and the ExxonMobil Campus Concerts, we enrich the university experience and contribute to the building of knowledge and transformation of students.

CFA also manages facilities such as the University Cultural Centre, with its 1700-seat Hall and 425-seat Theatre, and rehearsal spaces in Runme Shaw CFA Studios and University Town.

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NUS DANCE ENSEMBLE

NUS Dance Ensemble (NUS DE), a member of NUS Centre For the Arts, was founded in 1992 by Resident Choreographer and Artistic Director, Zaini Mohd Tahir. As a group, NUS DE comprises of mostly NUS undergraduates, together with a strong base of extremely dedicated alumni.

NUS DE has a unique style of Asian Contemporary dance that is rooted in Asian tradition and also seamlessly incorporates western jazz, ballet and contemporary techniques. Through its dynamic style and modern interpretations of ethnic elements, NUS DE has earned wide recognition for its unconventional repertoire.

Since its first concert at Kallang Theatre in 1992, NUS DE has been staging two major annual productions - Evocation and The Next Wave, and has a total annual audience of at least 3,000, including students, adults, dancers and corporate companies. NUS DE has also been active at external events such as Republic Polytechnic's Momentum, the National Arts Council's Got To Move and ITE's Emblazon. NUS DE also regularly performs for various NUS events such as HERE! and the Student Life Fair.

NUS DANCE ENSEMBLE

NUS DE has not only established itself locally but has also expanded its reach to neighbouring Asian regions including Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, Philipphines, and Cambodia.

NUS DE also represented Singapore at the China-ASEAN Youth Arts Festival in Guizhou in 2008. At the New Prague Dance Festival held in Prague in 2009, NUS DE bagged the awards of Best Choreography and Special Personal Award of the Director amongst some 400 over reputable contestants worldwide. In 2012, in collaboration with De La Salle University-College of San Benilde, NUS DE presented its works at ObservAsian in Manila and in Singapore. In July 2016, NUS DE also participated in the International Youth Dance Festival 2016 in Macau.

Ultimately, NUS DE aims to be a platform for collaborative work between dance companies and institutions in South East Asia.

About Zaini Mohd Tahir

Zaini is the founder and Artistic Director of NUS Dance Ensemble since 1992 and has led the company of over 120 dancers to great acclaim, evident in their annual concerts, Next Wave and Evocation, as well as exchanges in Indonesia, Cambodia, Macau, Malaysia, Thailand, Philippines and Hong Kong. His other choreographic/directorial works include CABARET (Toy Factory, 2006). Singapore Day in New York (2007), National Broadway Company (TheatreWorks, 2012), MIDEM Music Festival at Cannes (2012), Samarpaana Festival (Bangalore Singapore, and 2013), Beauty World (2015), As One (Nanyang Poly, 2015), Dance Momentum **Festival** (Republic Poly, 2008-2019) and Emblazon Dance Concert (Institute of Technical Education, 2013-2019).



His last cross-border projects include choreographing Osman Ali's latest musical film, 'Sinaran' with Malaysian star Lisa Surihani and Sheila Majid, and being the Singapore judge for Zee TV's reality dance show, Dance Singapore Dance, which was televisedalloverAsia.Hehasalso been invited to be in the panel of adjudicators for numerous dance competitions including The Royal Dance Off (O School, 2011-2017) and Singapore Youth Festival Presentation (Ministry of Education, 2013-2019). He was the Chief Choreographer of National Day Parade 2014, 2015, 2018 and 2019.

At the New Prague Dance Festival held in July 2009, he received two accolades – Best Choreographer Award and a Special Award by the Festival Director and in 2010, he was presented the Commendation Medal at the National Day Awards for his contribution to the youths though the arts.
